On 1st October 2002 the United States will establish "United States Northern Command." This American military command may influence and change Canada/United States (CANUS) defence relations in important ways for many years to come. At least it will require Canadians to face two critical policy questions: how best to ensure the defence of North America in cooperation with the United States and what degree of effort should the government devote to this essential national policy?

This conference is intended to help create an informed public debate on these and other CANUS policy questions in a forum where distinguished speakers and invited experts will address the military and political aspects of the new United States command and future CANUS defence relations in general.
