- **Security and Democracy.** In *Catch and Release: A Role for Preventive Detention without Charge in Canadian Anti-terrorism Law*, **Craig Force** argues that preventive detention can be justified for particular persons to disrupt specific threats under restricted conditions, while balancing the objectives of maintaining security and respecting civil liberties, as did the original 2001 Anti-terrorism Act.

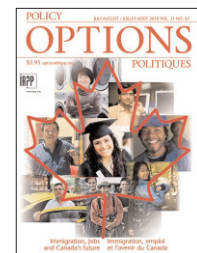
